**Medi-Cal Adult Day Health Care Transition Program
Participant Assessment**

As part of DHCS' Adult Day health Care Transition Plan it is imperative that the Department assess ADHC participants' needs for long-term services and supports after the ADHC benefit is no longer covered by Medi-Cal. To execute this process DHCS has contracted with APS Healthcare (APS) to perform in-person and telephonic ADHC participant assessments for provision of these services and supports.

APS will begin its outreach to participants October 5, 2011. In order to better facilitate the assessment and subsequent provision of appropriate services, DHCS requests that you provide APS with access to ADHC participants currently under your care. APS would like to arrange to meet with your participants at your center during the next few weeks. APS will contact you to schedule times to meet with your participants and key discharge planning staff. DHCS anticipates that APS and the ADHC centers will work closely to ensure the discharge planning allows for a smooth transition of beneficiaries to other services.
