INITIATIVES

The Master Plan for Aging (MPA) is a 10-year blueprint that reflects California's future vision of and commitment to an age- and ability-forward state. The MPA outlines Five Bold Goals to build a California for ALL by 2030. The MPA is both a whole-of-government effort with leadership across the Newsom administration and state Legislature, and a whole-of-community dialogue rooted in the active engagement of local, state, and philanthropic partners.

Every two years, the MPA Cabinet Workgroup and state MPA partners recommit to a new set of initiatives that focus on meeting the priority needs of California's older adults, people with disabilities, and caregivers. Informed by the voices and perspectives of MPA stakeholders and communities, California will advance 81 MPA initiatives in 2025-26, building upon the work that began in January 2021 when the MPA was launched.

The 2025-26 MPA Initiatives reinforce California's core values and principles of equity, community engagement, innovation, and delivering results. Over the next two years, California will continue to utilize data to drive action, deepen equity, and implement person-centered approaches to policies, programs, and services.

To ensure transparency and accountability, the [MPA Implementation Tracker](#) remains a publicly available resource for monitoring the implementation of the MPA Initiatives. The 2025-26 MPA Initiatives represent California's comprehensive plan to serve and support older adults, people with disabilities, and caregivers now and into the future.
