Results 9–11 often embed PAL contact data within Expedia, Priceline, or traditional agency websites. These pages display the airline’s number but instruct travelers to “contact your booking agent” for modifications. Category 4: Social, Forum, and Community Discussions

Philippine Airlines does not apply a single, universal change fee. Instead, the airline uses a **fare-family architecture** that ties change privileges to the ticket’s original booking class. The following framework applies to international flights originating from or terminating in the United States, with domestic Philippine routes following similar but often less restrictive rules.

1. Fare Family Classification

- A free change to another PAL flight.
